Getting there:

Coming from the North take exit 226. Turn left to go under the freeway and up the hill. This is Broadway Street. Continue on Broadway to S 13th Street (which is about 5 to 6 blocks from the freeway). Turn right (south) onto S 13th and go about 6 blocks. The park is on the right. Turn into the park the parking lot is in front of the lodge.

Coming from the South take exit 225. Turn right off the freeway then take a left onto Cedardale, which is the frontage road to the freeway. Go to the stop sign. Turn right at the stop sign onto Blackburn, go about a block and turn left (north) onto S 13th Street. The park entrance is on the left about a block from the intersection, just past the soccer field. The parking lot is on the left with the lodge in the northwest corner of the parking lot.


